When the planning application was being discussed, Hythe town councillors who—are talso members of the development control committee, had to leave the room because they were considered to have an interest in the scheme. Clir Wendy Harris stated she was not happy that town councillors could not speak on the issue.

Clir Alan Roots proposed refusal of the plans. He said: "I am not happy with the plan at all. Our policies say we should protect open spaces. If there was a proven need for another halt, which I don't think there is, it would be different.

Before the meeting the chairman of Hythe Community Centre Trust resigned after just two months. Geoffrey Roberts of Saltwood cited the inability of the council to support the trust it used recreated as his reason for resigning.
